1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

2 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

3 MINUTES

The Licensing Officer reported that in regard to the advertisement of the traffic order for the proposed changes to the existing Hackney Carriage Stand, that one representation had been received.

5 APPLICATION FOR A NEW HACKNEY CARRIAGE AND PRIVATE HIRE DRIVER LICENCE

The Licensing Officer reported that an application had been received for a Hackney Carriage & Private Hire Driver Licence, in view of previous convictions.

Information from the Disclosure & Barring Service indicated that the applicant had two previous convictions. However, the applicant had failed to disclose a third conviction on his application form. This conviction resulted from him illegally working as a private hire driver after his licence had been revoked by another authority.

The Licensing Officer reported that offences involving assault would be viewed particularly seriously and that applications were likely to be refused if a serious offence had been committed in the past five years.

The Committee decided that the applicant was not a fit and proper person to be granted a drivers licence.

RESOLVED:

That the application for a first class Hackney Carriage / Private Hire Drivers Licence be refused on the grounds that the Committee did not consider the applicant to be fit and proper person to hold a licence.

SUBJECT MATTER AND DECISIONS REQUIRED:

Members are asked to formally appoint the following amendments to an existing first class hackney carriage stand:

	Existing Location	Proposed location
(East side)	From a point 33 metres south of its junction with South Market Road southwards for a distance of 19 metres. From a point 71 metres south of its junction with South Market Road southwards for a distance of 38 metres.	From a point 63 metres south of the centreline of the junction of the U60486 South Market Road southwards for a distance of 46 metres. The stand will be appointed for use at all times by a maximum of 8 first class hackney carriages.

1. Background:

- 1.1 Norfolk County Council proposed some amendments to the existing Hackney Carriage stand at Temple Road. This was suggested to alleviate problems caused by the bus stop being in the middle of the two taxi ranks.
- 1.2 Licensing committee at their meeting of 22 July 2019 discussed the proposals after considering comments received from the informal consultation with all Hackney Carriage plateholders. It was agreed to proceed with the formal notice process outlined in point 1.3 below.
- 1.3 Section 63 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 empowers the Council to appoint and remove stands for hackney carriages. However, before doing so, the Council must give notice to the police, and also to the public by way of a newspaper advertisement, allowing 28 days for any representations to be received.
- 1.4 The required notices were given on 2 August 2019, with the public allowed until 5 September 2019 to make representations. One representation was received, which is attached for consideration.
- 1.5 The proposals would allow the highway improvements sought by the County Council to be implemented and the same time alleviating some of the

congestion issues currently caused at the rank. It is therefore recommended that the Council proceed to make the amendments to the existing stand.

2. Recommendation

It is recommended that members approve the following:
