Subject: Application for variation of a premises licence : Cherry Tree Holiday Park, Mill Road, Burgh Castle, Great Yarmouth

SUBJECT MATTER AND DECISION REQUIRED

The Licensing Sub-Committee is asked to consider the premises licence variation application in relation to Cherry Tree Holiday Park, Mill Road, Burgh Castle, Great Yarmouth.

Recommendations:

It is recommended that the Sub-Committee determines the application for variation of the premises licence in accordance with one of the options set out in paragraph 4 below.

1. Application for a variation of a premises licence

1.1 Members are asked to consider an application made by Parkdean Caravan Parks Limited for a variation of the premises licence of Cherry Tree Holiday Park, Mill Road, Burgh Castle, Great Yarmouth.

1.2 The nature of the variation is:

- The addition of: indoor sporting events, provision of anything similar to live, recorded music
 and performance of dance and wrestling,
 Monday to Sunday, from 10.00 to 02.00 the following morning
 Non standard timings of an additional hour on the morning British
 Summertime commences, and from the end of permitted hours on New Year's
 Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.
- The addition of:
 Late night refreshment indoors
 Monday to Sunday, from 23.00 to 02.00 the following morning
 Non standard timings of an additional hour on the morning British
 Summertime commences, and from the end of permitted hours on New Year's
 Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

- To extend to outdoors: plays, films, live music, recorded music, performance of dance and provision of
 anything similar to live, recorded music and performance of dance,
 Monday to Sunday, from 12.00 to 23.00.
- To amend the layout plans (both indoors and outdoors) as supplied to the Licensing Authority with the application
- To remove old obsolete or irrelevant conditions to be replaced with up to date and more appropriate conditions regarding door supervisors, safe occupancy, Challenge 25 and ID checks.

2. Background information

- 2.1 The application was sent to the Responsible Authorities, advertised by notice at the premise and in a newspaper and detailed on the Council's website.
- 2.2 Upon expiry of the 28 day representation period, five valid representations were received. Four representations are from local residents and one is from the parish council. Four of the representations are objecting to the application and one is in support but offers suggestions regarding the extent of the variation.

- From 18.00 two door supervisors shall be on duty. A register of names will be kept along with times they were on duty. The door staff shall carry their proof of registration with the SIA and wear their name badges at all times.
- Consideration will be given to fixing a capacity limit after consultation with the fire service, if deemed necessary
- There shall be sufficient adequately trained staff to ensure safe evacuation from the premises in the event of an emergency.
- 4. All fire escape routes shall be kept unobstructed and be clearly identifiable.
- 5. All fire exit doors shall be capable of opening without use of any key, card, code or
- Hangings, curtains and temporary decorations shall be maintained in a flameretardant condition and shall not obstruct fire exits, fire safety signs or firefighting equipment.
- 7. All upholstered seating shall comply with current fire safety regulations.

- Fire evacuation tests shall be carried out every 6 months and a record kept, all firefighting equipment and emergency lighting shall be maintained in good working order.
- 9. At least one first aider shall be on duty.
- Fire doors will be self-closing and shall not be held open other than by devices approved by the Fire Service or Health and Safety department.
- 11. Edges to steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 12. The premises shall observe the Portman Group's code of practice on the naming, packaging and promotion of alcoholic drinks.
- 13. An adequate supply of free drinking water shall be provided for customers.
- 14. The premises shall operate a photographic proof of age scheme.
- 15. Where performances are presented especially for unaccompanied children there shall be at least one attendant for every 50 children or part thereof.
- 16. All staff working in the Entertainment venues or security staff must provide Parkdean Caravan Parks Limited with a Criminal Record Bureau Check.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - · Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.





- 4. An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:
 - (a) Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise):
 - (b) Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective:
 - (c) Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability):
- The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

 - (b) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(c) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either -

a holographic mark or an ultraviolet feature.

- 7. The responsible person must ensure that:
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 9. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 9-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

(i) P is the permitted price.

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

A text/pager/radio will be used to keep in contact with the premises providing licensable activities on the park.

From 18.00 two door supervisors shall be on duty. A register of names will be kept along with times they were on duty. The door staff shall carry their proof of registration with the SIA and wear their name badges at all times.

The licensee shall, within the licensed premises, provide and maintain efficient video recording equipment (CCTV) and recordings shall be kept for a period of one month.

No person who is the subject of a court banning order shall be allowed in the premises provided the details of such person have been provided by the police.

No customer shall be allowed to bring alcohol in open or sealed bottles on the premises.

Tables shall be cleared of all empty bottles and glasses on a regular basis.

Promotion of Public Safety

Consideration will be given to fixing a capacity limit after consultation with the fire service, if deemed necessary.

There shall be sufficient adequately trained staff to ensure safe evacuation from the premises in the event of an emergency.

All fire escape routes shall be kept unobstructed, and be clearly identifiable.

All fire exit doors shall be capable of opening without use of any key, card, code or similar means.

Hangings, curtains and temporary decorations shall be maintained in a flame retardant condition and shall not obstruct fire exits, fire safety signs or fire fighting equipment.

All upholstered seating shall comply with current fire safety regulations.

Fire evacuation tests shall be carried out every 6 months and a record kept, all fire fighting equipment and emergency lighting shall be maintained in good working order.

At least one first aider shall be on duty.

There shall be no demonstration of hypnotism without prior approval of the Licensing Authority.

An adequate supply of free drinking water shall be provided for customers.

Risk assessments will regularly take place at the premises and an action plan will be prepared and implemented.

Fire doors will be self closing and shall not be held open other than by devices approved by the Fire Service or Health and Safety department.

Edges to steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Doors and windows will be kept closed where necessary.

The playing of recorded music in any outside area shall not continue after 23.00

Protection of Children from Harm

The premises shall operate a photographic proof of age scheme.

All staff shall be trained to ensure that no person under the age of 18 is sold intoxicating liquor.

No performance involving nudity or striptease shall take place at the premises.

The premises shall observe the Portman Group's code of practice on the naming, packaging and promotion of alcoholic drinks.

Where performances are presented especially for unaccompanied children there shall be at least one attendant for every 50 children or part thereof.



Good evening,

I am writing to raise concerns about the proposed variation of premises licence at Parkdean Caravan Park (Cherry Tree, Mill Rd, Burgh Castle).

Living in extremely close proximity, the area of concern relates to the extension of potential noise nuisance this will cause. The power of the amplification of music etc is already clearly audible in a wide area outside of the site. If the music etc is allowed to extend for more than 11 hours a day this will create an unacceptable nuisance factor for us neighbours that work full time. 7 days a week and 2am is simply disrespectful.

How will lighting levels of outdoors events affect us too? Extending usage-will the extended opening hours lead to unacceptable levels of light pollution?

Before any varied licence is granted tests should be completed to ascertain if noise levels can be kept at an acceptable level.

We strongly object to this application on the grounds of public nuisance. Extending late night music 7 days a week will be a public nuisance and breach our entitlement of quiet in our homes - a legal right. We need to try to preserve some form of peace and quiet in this rural environment.

Cherry Tree Holiday Park, Mill Road, Burgh Castle - Variation to Premises License

Burgh Castle Parish Council strongly objects to the premises licence being extended.

Any intensification of activities at Cherry Tree Holiday Park that will increase noise and light pollution, coupled with possible extra late night traffic movement, and reduction of security that may allow unrestricted movement into the park's activities should not be allowed.

There is enough noise pollution in the summer from this location, outdoor music until 11pm would be a nuisance to neighbouring residents and depending on the prevailing wind could be extremely noisy, it also may encourage anti-social behaviour. A 2.00am indoor license would be much the same, encouraging people to drink until much later in the evening/early hours of the morning, which again could lead to anti-social behaviour. Some of the other holiday parks owned by the company may already have extended licenses such Vauxhall Holiday Park, however they are located in different parts of the borough and are not set in a village like Burgh Castle where the Cherry Tree Holiday Park is located.

There is also concern an extension to the licence may allow them to hold events out of the main holiday season, which could result in a large amount of additional transient weekend traffic which may extend the season. If these events were to be staged they could attract a large number of people who have no affinity to the area. All late night events should be specifically restricted to 'residents' of Cherry Tree site and exclude use by residents from any other Parkdene sites to prevent late night travel and disturbance.

Thank you for taking the time to respond to me having followed up my enquiry with Cherry Tree's agent.

I am comforted by the fact they have already been holding outdoor events on a temporary basis, given these events have not caused us any concern.

A couple of thoughts, given their request would enable them to say, play recorded music outside all year round late into the evening, there is the potential for this to become a nuisance, which as I see it, is dependent upon the following two factors: volume and time. On the basis their previous temporary requests for outdoor events have been during the periods listed below, is an all year-round licence variation necessary? The Council could provide the variation in accordance with what the park actually requires (see your email dated 14th Feb and below), whilst reserving their position via TENs outside of these key trading periods. Could I also suggest a maximum volume is considered?

To summarise, I would like to make a formal representation/suggestion as follows:

Fundamentally supportive of Cherry Tree's request to vary the licence agreement subject to;

Can the variation match the periods they currently enjoy but via many TENs: peak (mid June - mid September), bank holiday weekends, and school holidays (throughout the year)?

Can a maximum volume be determined to mitigate any potential for nuisance as a result of excessive airborne sound transmission?

The above would appear to give Cherry Tree what it requires whilst also protecting immediate residents from any unreasonable nuisance. Cherry Tree secures a variation removing the requirement for TENs entirely during their peak operational periods, only having to apply for TENs in the unlikely event they wish to hold an outdoor activity outside of these. A volume cap would ensure they get what they need, whilst providing the licencing team with a simple mechanism for proving a nuisance should one be claimed.

I suspect we will continue to live in harmony but a less broad variation would ensure it.

Further to my earlier email, I have received a response from the holiday park's agent containing further information on the proposed variation, as detailed below:

'In a nutshell there is not plan to change the type and frequency of outdoor entertainment compared to previous years. What this application does (if granted) is allow my client to run their entertainment under the terms of the Premises Licence and not have to issue TENs each time the proposed entertainment falls outside the scope of the Premises Licence in its current form.

The park currently hold outdoor entertainment during the following periods:

- peak (mid June mid September)
- bank holiday weekends, and
- school holidays (throughout the year)

Usually the entertainment consists of outdoor movie nights 2 or 3 times per week, occasional family fun sports days and live acts 1 or 2 times per week. To date there have been no complaints about noise nuisance communicated to my client so they assume they operate these events in such that local residents are not disturbed.'
