7 NEWS

The Chairman reported that the Times Newspaper had published a picture of the Minster's Organ stating that they were raising funds for its restoration and a cheque for £2,000 was received into the Minster Organ Fund.

It was reported that the Rector would be retiring in July 2016.

The Chairman stated that he had looked into advertising on the PIP's and that the Minster would only be able to advertise on 5 of the PIP's and that this would only be until people pay to advertise on them and then the minster's advertising would be removed. Also the Trust would have to pay for any printing. Sandra suggested advertising in the NR29 guide as this would be free and agreed to look into this further.

8 RE-ORDERING UPDATE (Michael Boon)

It was reported that Extensive and detailed discussions have been taking place regarding the future heating of the Minster. A schematic plan has been prepared by the Minster Architect to enable the commissioning of an extension to the original report to now provide ambient heating throughout the Minster. The terms of reference will be finalised by the Minster Development Group to enable the selected heating consultant to prepare the report as part of the Minster's grant application. Following this decision Mr Boon is now able to write to the Masonic Charity following the meeting which he and Canon Terry attended earlier to put down a marker for possible grant assistance from this source as the project moves forward. The Preservation Trust's effort in providing funding towards the heating system is one of the partnership arrangements which the Minster Development Group hopes to extend. The Minster

Quinquennial Report, which provides details on necessary capital and repair works over the next five years, has now been completed. This will also be part of the application. The example of an excellent performance of Messiah sponsored by the Preservation Trust, staging an imaginative production in the Nave, will provide the beginnings of the development of the building for new and sustainable uses. The Minster was unsuccessful in the first round of applications for repairs to the leaking South Porch Roof under the Government's roof repair initiative scheme. The Government has now provided additional funding so a further application for this £50,000 Minster key works scheme will be submitted in the second round. As reported at the last meeting the Minster and its Development Group feel that professional Publicity Assistance would be helpful to both the project and the operations in the Minster supporting it. Enquiries to identify potential assistance are being made and any useful leads for the Development Group to pursue would be welcome.
